



Turing Scheme 2024-25 - Factsheet

The Turing Scheme is the UK government's programme which aims to financially contribute to some of the costs incurred by students undertaking international mobilities, these must be

- A minimum duration of 28 days / 4 weeks, maximum duration 12 months
- Take place between 1 September 2024 to 31 August 2025

Participants can be undergraduate, postgraduate or PhD, and activities which can be considered include study abroad, internships / work experience, research, volunteering, and summer schools.

The Turing Scheme is committed to widening access to study abroad and funding is prioritised to supporting students from less advantaged backgrounds. Students are considered widening participation if they fulfil one of the below criteria:

- Participants with an annual household income of £25,000 or less
- Participants receiving Universal Credit or income-related benefits.
- Care leavers and care experienced students.
- Students who have caring responsibilities for a family member or friend.
- Estranged students.
- Refugees and asylum seekers.

Funding

It is a competitive process to be awarded Turing Funding, the outcome is not guaranteed. If successful, funding is available to contribute to the cost of living in the form of a maintenance grant, with widening participation students eligible for a travel grant.

Maintenance Grant:

The Turing Scheme provides maintenance grants towards the general cost of living abroad. The amount is calculated on a per day basis and dependent on the destination. Destinations are grouped into 2 categories, Group 1 (higher cost of living), and Group 2 (lower of living).

Group 1: American Samoa, Australia, Bahamas, Barbados, Bermuda, Canada, Cayman Islands, Cook Islands, Tokelau and Niue, Cuba, Israel, Japan, Kiribati, New Caledonia, New Zealand, North America not otherwise specified, Papua New Guinea, Puerto Rico, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Switzerland, Tonga, Turks and Caicos Islands, United States, Vanuatu, Venezuela.

Any country not listed above will be Group 2.

Travel grants of £250 to £1,360 are available to **widening participation students** as defined above, depending on the distance of the destination country.

For example, a non-WP student going to Canada for 28 days would be eligible for £532 in maintenance funding only. A WP student would receive £644 maintenance grant and a travel grant of £745, a total of £1,389 overall.

80% of funding will be paid to the student one month before departure, with the remaining 20% on their return to the UK and submission of all documents.
